Thanks for your interest in the Launch Innovation Accelerator. Applications will be formally opening soon! In the meantime, you can start to prepare for your application by taking a look at the questions below. You can expect to answer these questions on your application. The full application for the Launch Accelerator may take up to 2 hours to complete.

Innovation teams who want to focus on scaling and sustaining their innovation are a great fit for Launch. As you can see in our program description, we will spend a lot of time considering the desirability, feasibility and viability of your innovation—and what that means for how you make the innovation available to the world. Specifically, we are seeking teams that have:

- Already developed a prototype or innovation
- Obtained feedback from some end-users about its usefulness
- Have a sense of its potential impact

If this sounds like you and your team, we encourage you to apply!

If you are not sure if your innovation team's idea is the right fit for the Launch Accelerator, we encourage you to complete questions 1 through 7 to receive information about other innovation hubs that might be appropriate for your innovation and to provide the Launch team with important information for improvement in future cohort recruitment.

Please note that the Launch Accelerator is funded by the Office Assistant Secretary of Health's (OASH) Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program (TPP Program). The Program Policy Notice (PPN) published on July 1, 2025 delineates when materials and activities are not "medically accurate," "age appropriate," do not "reduce teen pregnancy," or are otherwise outside the scope of the TPP Program. We encourage you to review this policy notice before developing your application materials to ensure that you are aware of the funding requirements, the content that will be supported, and the actions that may be required by innovators. You will be required to confirm your understanding and acceptance of this policy before submitting your application. - Stage 4 You have a team with the necessary knowledge and know-how to develop your innovation, have developed your idea or prototype, have obtained feedback from some end-users about its usefulness, and evaluated its impact – now you are looking to scale it up or refine your approach.
- Stage 5 You have demonstrated the scalability of your innovation now you would like support for your innovation.

- 8. Provide a detailed description of your proposed innovation and the gap in teen pregnancy prevention your innovation is seeking to address.
- 9. How is your innovation different compared to other solutions or strategies that address this gap?
- 10. Tell us about each of your team members who will work on this innovation development team.

 - What is their role as a member of this team?
 - Why were they chosen for this role?

Be sure to let us know if you have involved young people or key collaborators (e.g., parents) on your team and/or into your innovation design.

- 12. How do you know that this innovation will fill an existing gap for your end user group of focus? Provide information on market opportunity (appeal and need).
- 13. How will you make your innovation available to the end user group of focus?
- 14. If successful, what will be the impact of your innovation?
